

Different Readings at 10:30 am Mass: The Church uses a three-year cycle of readings. We call them, Year A, Year B and Year C. This year we are in the Year C cycle. However, when we celebrate the scrutinies for the RCIA, we always use the readings from Year A. This is why you will notice that your missalette has different readings than the ones you will hear at the 10:30 am Mass.
